SUNDAY CONNECTION - A Bible Study on this week's Gospel Reading- By Loyola Press.com

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share forgiveness and reconciliation with others. Within normal family life, there are many opportunities for conflict. Jesus did not promise us the absence of conflict in our lives. Instead, he gave us the gifts of peace,

forgiveness, and reconciliation so that we could reduce conflict. The measure of Christian family life is not the absence of conflict, but the manner in which conflict is resolved. Filled with the gift of the Holy Spirit, we ask Jesus to help us to bring peace and forgiveness to situations of conflict in our families.


