

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee. Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the

Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

Dear friends,

I am happy to share some wonderful news about Selena, the child we sponsor in Kenya. Our church gave Fr. Paul the funds so that Selena could attend an assessment on her condition, with the hopes that she could begin to attend school. Most of the schools

in this part of Africa are boarding schools, and up until now, Selena has not been able to attend school because of her inability to walk very well and care for herself. She has braces on her legs and uses crutches as well as a walker at times. The good news is that she passed her assessment and she will be able to attend school with other children soon. She went to the assessment with her aunt and her grandfather. Selena lost her parents to an epidemic many years ago, and now lives with her elderly grandfather. She has a sister and a brother but they attend a boarding school and are not home to help care for Selena. Her aunt has her own family but has been



kind enough to go with Selena to the assessment appointment. Father Paul's brother lives nearby and sent this picture. Selena is wearing a red and white sweater, and is sitting with her aunt, who is wearing the pink shirt. We were also told Selena might undergo another surgery on her hips later this year. I was told she was very happy to receive the books we sent last fall. Thank you for your continued support of our church and the outreach we are able to give to help those in need. Keep up the prayers for Selena and her family!






